English

Listening & Speaking:

- Share opinions about poems
- Present own poem to a class audience

Reading & Viewing:

• Read, view and comprehend poems, songs, and rhymes

Writing & Creating:

Structured Literacy

• Participate in explicit daily lessons to develop handwriting, spelling, dictation, and vocabulary.

Maths

Number

- Use knowledge of place value, awareness of inverse operations and a range of calculation strategies to balance and solve equations that include a missing number
- add and subtract two- and three-digit numbers using place value to partition, rearrange and regroup numbers to assist in calculations without a calculator
- follow and create algorithms involving a sequence of steps and decisions to investigate numbers; describe any emerging patterns
- use mathematical modelling to solve practical problems involving additive and multiplicative situations using digital tools where appropriate

Probability

- conduct repeated chance experiments; identify and describe possible outcomes, record the results, recognise and discuss the variation
- describe possible outcomes and events as 'likely' or 'unlikely' and identify some events as 'certain' or 'impossible' explaining reasoning.

Structured Numeracy

• Participate in explicit daily lessons to develop fluency, reasoning, problem-solving skills, flexible thinking and a positive disposition towards Maths.

Humanities & Social Sciences

Brisbane – Meanjin

Students explore the history the Brisbane River (Maiwar) and the people who lived on and used the surrounding land in current inner-city Brisbane – Meanjin.

The Arts - Music

Students will:

- play glockenspiel/xylophone.
- read and write using the musical staff.
- perform both individually and in a group this semester.
