Year 5 Term 2, 2025

English

Reading & Viewing

• Read, view and comprehend a range of fiction and non-fiction texts based on natural disasters.

Writing & Creating

• Plan, create, edit and publish information reports and multimodal texts on natural disasters.

Structured Literacy

 Participate in explicit daily lessons to develop handwriting, spelling, dictation, and vocabulary.

Science

Students will:

- Explore how sudden geological changes and extreme weather events can affect Earth's surface.
- Consider effects of earthquakes and volcanoes on Earth's surface and how communities are affected.
- Gather, record and interpret data relating to weather and weather events.
- Plan, create and edit an advisory brochure for a natural disaster

Humanities & Social Sciences

Students will:

- Analyse data and maps to identify and describe the human and environmental factors that influence the characteristics of places before, during and after Natural Disasters
- Investigate the interconnections between people and environments during Natural Disasters

Health & Physical Education Movement

- Develop the movement skills of running, jumping and throwing skills.
- Perform sprints, middle distance running, long jump, high jump, shot-put and vortex throw sequences.

Maths

Number & Algebra

- Express natural numbers as products of factors and identify multiples.
- Check reasonableness of answers using estimation
- Apply properties of numbers and operations to find unknown values
- Use mathematical modelling to solve financial and other practical problems.

Measurement

• Convert between 12 and 24hr time.

Structured Numeracy

• Participate in explicit daily lessons to develop fluency, reasoning, problem-solving skills, flexible thinking and a positive disposition towards Maths.

The Arts - Music

Students will:

- compose using rhythm, pitch and musical staff.
- research and present to class unusual musical instrument
- perform folk songs as a class.
- create live looping performances using percussion instruments.

The Arts – Drama

Students will:

make and respond to drama using a range of dramatic modes including movement, media, props and performance spaces.

Languages – Japanese

- Students will:
- Practise writing and reading Hiragana script
- Build on their knowledge of Japanese language to be able to express information about themselves including their hobbies, likes and dislikes.
