English

Listening & Speaking

Structured Literacy

 Participate in explicit daily lessons to develop handwriting, spelling, dictation, and vocabulary.

Humanities & Social Sciences/ Design Tech

- Learn about the purpose of businesses and the relationships between producers, consumers, goods and services.
- Explore the influences on consumers.
- Examine human needs and wants and the three types of resources: human, capital and natural.
- Explore the concepts scarcity, opportunity cost and trade-offs.
- Collaboratively plan and design a base to meet the humans needs of a crew living on Mars.
