English

Listening & Speaking

 Plan, create, rehearse and deliver spoken and multimodal presentations.

Reading & Viewing

- Identify aspects of literary texts that represent details or information about natural disasters
- Describe how spoken, written and multimodal texts use language features and are typically organised.

Writing & Creating

 Plan, create, edit and publish information reports. and multimodal texts

Structured Literacy

 Participate in explicit daily lessons to develop handwriting, spelling, dictation, and vocabulary.

Science

Students will:

- explore how sudden geological changes and extreme weather events can affect Earth's surface.
- consider effects of earthquakes and volcanoes on Earth's surface and how communities are affected.
- gather, record and interpret data relating to weather and weather events.

Humanities & Social Sciences

Students will:

- analyse data and maps to identify and describe the human and environmental factors that influence the characteristics of places.
- investigate the interconnections between people and environments.

Movement

- Develop the fundamental movement skills of running, jumping and throwing skills.
- Perform sprints, middle distance running, long jump, high jump, shot-put and vortex throw sequences.

- Check reasonableness of answers using estimation
- Apply properties of numbers and operations to find unknown values
- Use mathematical modelling to solve financial and other practical problems, formulating and solving problems, choosing arithmetic operations and interpreting results in terms of the situation.

• Participate in explicit daily lessons to develop fluency, reasoning, problem-solving skills, flexible thinking and a positive disposition towards Maths.

The Arts - Music

Students will:

- compose using rhythm, pitch and musical staff.
- research and present to class unusual musical instrument
- perform folk songs as a class.
- create live looping performances using percussion instruments.

The Arts - Drama

Students will:

 make and respond to drama using a range of dramatic modes including movement, media, props and performance spaces.

Languages – Japanese

Students will:

- · learn about Japan and Japanese customs.
- make presentations about their name, age, family, interests and where they live
- find specific information in a spoken text.
